After Instructor Training, the only cost is for printed 13-piece Folios (which depend solely on how often you will facilitate the program). Cost of Folios range from \$3.50 to \$4.50 per woman depending upon quantity ordered. Although 'S.A.F.E.' is a community service program, you have the OPTION of obtaining grants or local sponsors to fund your programs OR charging each woman participant up to a onetime \$5.00 fee to cover cost of materials

As of June 2010, NSDI has trained and certified over 1,000 instructors from 465 agencies (primarily municipal police/county sheriff's offices and college/university campus public safety departments) in 33 States (plus Ontario, Canada) to serve 48,624 women.
