- The nomination can be made by a member, an executive or officer of that organization or by someone from outside the organization who has knowledge of the group's accomplishments.
- The nomination must include:
 - Name and address of the organization
 - Name of the Officers and Board of Directors
 - o Geographical area covered
 - Agencies and/or businesses the organization represents
- Nomination must include the accomplishments of the organization from October 2013 to September 2014 entitling them to this nomination.
- Nomination must include at least one (1) letter of recommendation from someone, not a member of the organization, who has knowledge of the organization's accomplishments.

Since taking office Sheriff Michael A. Adkinson Jr. has been committed to being more service oriented toward the residents and visitors of Walton County. Some of the new programs he has started have paid great dividends for the county in the crime reduction, response time, and the solvability of the crimes that have occurred.

In the past year Sheriff Adkinson has had the Crime Prevention unit, as well as other bureaus, look for newer and cutting edge ways to combat the crimes that we have designated as frequent and on-going. Some of those are "Operation Avalanche" where the Agency, along with the States Attorney's Office, worked tirelessly to shut down meth labs and prescription drug abuse throughout the county.

To date, 30 arrests have been made in Operation Avalanche. This investigation is still on-going and more arrests are pending.





The app includes tips on keeping children safe as well guidance on what to do in those first crucial hours after a child goes missing. No information about you or your child will be collected or stored by the FBI or iTunes. The Agency put this on their facebook and web pages for greater reach in the community.



In October of last year the Walton County Sheriff's Office held the first "Citizens Law Enforcement Academy." This training was conducted over a 10 week time with 3 hours each week for the civilian students to get educated on the many facets of the local Sheriff's Office and each of the specified units. The topics covered were; Patrol, Arrests, Dispatch, Crime Scene processing, Criminal Investigations, Narcotics, Traffic Enforcement, K-9, School Resource Deputies, Firearms Safety, Crime Prevention, Crime Stoppers, Media and PIO, Emergency Management, Jail and staff, Defensive Tactics, RAD demonstration, SWAT, and Aviation.



This summer the Walton County Sheriff's Office decided to expand their annual Summer Camp to educate children at a young age about crimes, how to avoid being a victim and how to report those that they see. We did this primarily with the officers that they will see each day in the school to instil trust for the child. We did two weeks, instead of one, and still had a waiting list for the very popular hands on interactional program. Bike safety, pedestrian safety, anti-bullying, internet safety were just some of the training mixed into the fishing, pool, and zoo trips.



In conclusion this agency has, and continues to, work with the community and other law enforcement agencies to reduce the crime and improve the standard of living for the residents and visitors of Walton County Florida.
