Please accept this submission for consideration for the "Outstanding Crime Prevention Program" Category A. The "Kindergarten Cop" campaign was designed to address holiday safety. Two videos were produced with children playing the rolls of police officers and criminals. These videos depicted two traditional holiday crime scenarios regarding auto burglary and residential burglary and presented crime prevention information in a new way. The videos were featured on social media and were picked up by local news stations in at least 30 different TV markets from across the country. This resulted in the videos reaching millions of viewers.

Just some stats from the video. On Facebook alone the video reached 6.4 million people. 1.8 million people actually watched the video and more than 35,000 shared it to their friends. The video also aired before every movie at Cinemark Cinema Boca Raton from Black Friday until New Year's.

The videos were simple. We took children to show adults what they do every time they go shopping. The message was do not leave purchased items in your car visible to criminals. The second video was post holiday message. Many times people leave boxes of big ticket items on the curb, advertising to the criminal what they just bought.

This campaign was the most successful crime prevention campaign to date and many law enforcement agencies throughout the Country asked if they could borrow/use our video or concept for their community.

Planning and filming the videos may have required time and patience but the end result is wonderful! It is great to know that our Police Department cares enough about its residents to undertake whatever is needed to help us be safe.
